Message from the Principal



The expected ESR visit by the EDB to TKPSS came in early March. We took the opportunity as a driving force for new round of school development. We launched comprehensive review and started a self-improvement process at the beginning of this school year. With concerted effort by all staff, the comments received on various school performances were fairly positive.

In our School Development Plan (2011-15), enhancing the use of English in learning and teaching remains one of the school's major concerns. The expected outcomes are set as follows: (1) Planning and Smooth Implementation of Cross-curricular Training; (2) Enhancing the Professional Capability of Teachers; (3) Providing English Learning Activities for Students.

To meet the above targets, we have taken a series of measures. (1) Two experts at cross-curriculum development were invited as consultants for training and planning in different subjects. In 2012-13, our Integrated Sciences teachers and teachers of Humanities received training. They developed afterwards teaching materials with scaffolding to improve students' proficiency in English for learning the subject contents. In 2013-14, our two senior teachers also met with the consultant for sharpening their edge in English skills in their teaching.

(2) Non-English teachers were required to produce videos to demonstrate their teaching effectiveness in terms of English skills across the curriculum. In 2012-13, short videos were produced by our teachers with a view to arousing students' interest in the topics they teach. Students were invited to produce videos too on certain topics under the guidance of subject teachers. In 2013-14, video-shooting of students' work continued. All the videos have been broadcast during the Language Learning Enhancement Sessions.

(3) A wide range of English Day activities as well as other activities were organized. In 2012-13, six English Days were held to boost students' confidence in learning English and promote an English campus. The activities included English morning assemblies, 'Have Your Say' by students and lunch time Talent Shows. In addition, a study tour to England was organized to provide students with more exposure to authentic English environment. Students' horizons were widened through activities like home stay, interest classes, excursion, etc. In 2013-14, the English musical "The King and I" was presented by the English Drama Club to commemorate the 20th school anniversary. It was a great success. Apart from this, junior form excursion was arranged for younger kids to explore the world beyond their classroom. Voice dubbing competitions were also held and students were attracted.

Over the past four years (2011-15), our English teachers as well as teachers of Humanities have been dedicated to the same goal, students of the English Society advanced it, and students in general participated. It is worth noting here that the English Language Department has kept adapting the curriculum in both junior and senior forms. And the teachers adopted CCL methodology in teaching English lessons in line with the school's foci. To our gladness, students are found more motivated and engaged, with better academic results. My heartfelt thanks go to all the staff members and students concerned for their commitment and excellent work!

3D PRINTING?!

Dear Editor,

I am writing in response to your article on the subject of 3D printing for patients which will ease the pain they endure. As many patients are facing painful treatments and undergoing lengthy hospital stays, doctors have invented 3D printing for patients and it gives them satisfactory results. And the effects are as follows:

First and foremost, there are positive effects. Using the new approach, the patients are able to be discharged from hospital and walk normally within days of a surgery. Therefore, they can face less pain. Also, since they leave earlier, there are more sickbeds for patients who are seeking for help. So, it is advantageous to both the hospital and patients.

Secondly, after the surgery, the healing process can become shorter. The instruments can be used in an operation to fix plates and screws inside the body. Traditionally, the patient needed to wear a large external frame which would be pinned to the bone through their skin and the patient needed to stay immobile for a long time. And this instrument can help the doctor to accurately pin the frame into the bone. It is a great medical advancement.

Not only are there positive effects but also negative effects. As the 3D printing is a new instrument, the cost of the surgery may be higher. Not many people are willing to pay more money. Moreover, as it is a new instrument, the risk of the surgery will increase. Fewer people will do the surgery because they may be scared the surgery would fail.

To combat these problems, the hospital can make a report on the success rate of the surgery. Also, it is a must for hospitals to give successful examples to patients. For instance, Ann had rickets in her knees and heels hurt wherever she walked. But after the surgery, she was able to walk within days.

Warning and promotions are also important. If patients don't take the surgery, their deformity would grow worse and may affect some aspects of their life. If doctors give warning to patients, they will know the seriousness of not doing the surgery. The government can also produce some booklets to illustrate the process of the surgery to reduce the patients' worries.

Friends and parents also need to give strong support to patients. Their support can make the patients feel happier and accept the new instruments more quickly to ease the pain.

I hope that 3D printing can really help patients and become more popular. Also, I hope people can accept and try it once to ease their pain. Hospitals need to take action now.

The Third Runway

Nowadays, space in Hong Kong is insufficient. There are many ways to get more land for development, such as land reclamation. However, some groups have decided to lop off mountaintops to get land. This idea was brought up in 1992. Rather than reclamation, it is cheaper to obtain more land and it is more environmentally-friendly. It can also protect the dolphins. However, some people think the feasibility of this unorthodox plan is low. So, does this plan really work? The answer is yes.

First, there are two runways at the airport now. Undeniably, they may become saturated in the near future. Because of the above reasons, the third runway is needed. Reclamation is one of the methods, but it is too costly. Oppositely, the 1992 plan will not lead to these effects. Although it will shave the peaks off two hills, it will not change the configuration of the terrain as much as reclamation.

Second, some may think that the airport should use a segregated mode. The 1992 plan may affect the Disney's no-fly zone, which was approved by the government in 1999. The prediction done in the 1992 was not relevant in enhancing capacity of the existing dual runway system. But from my point of view, the low capacity doesn't mean the capacity is enough in the future. This problem must be solved one day, so we should take action as soon as possible. Simultaneously, the consideration of the no-fly zone can also be solved by discussing with Disneyland, or even removing a bit of land on Tai Yam Teng Peak so that we could locate the runway a little further back and to avoid the no-fly zone.

Because of the above reasons, I think the idea of excavating or lopping off the peaks to solve the problem of insufficient runways in the future has a high feasibility, especially in terms of the economy and environment.

Our Next Breath, Our Next Generation

When you stand on the side of Victoria Harbour and look up, what do you expect to see? An azure sky? Or a grey sky?

According to a recent Air Quality Health Index monthly summary, over 60% of the general stations get 'moderate', 'high' or even 'very high' pollution ratings. The worst situation is over 90% of the roadside stations get those levels. What is more, Hong Kong's air quality objective for particulates is 180, and yet according to the World Health Organization guidelines, the maximum should be 50. The above data reveals the extreme air pollution that we are facing.

Urban and cramped areas, like Sham Shui Po and Yau Ma Tei, are devoid of greenery. When we walk through the streets, it is much more difficult for people to breathe than in rural areas. The situation is even worse in summer as there is no wind and the air is extremely hot. Why does it happen?

One main reason why air pollution in Hong Kong is so serious is the presence of factories near the Pearl River Delta. As the wages of Chinese workers are usually low, over 7000 factories have set up there, such as H&M factories. During the production process, air in the surrounding is all polluted by suspended particles and sulphur dioxide. When the wind blows from the north to the south, the polluted air will be blown to Hong Kong easily, owing to the short distance between the two places. This exacerbates the air pollution in Hong Kong.

Besides the factories in the mainland, generating power by coal in Hong Kong is another reason for the worsening air pollution. China Light and Power and HK Electric Holdings, the two electric companies in Hong Kong, emit 76,273.97 tonnes of carbon dioxide into the air every day. That is 3,190 tonnes per hour. That is tremendous, isn't it? Thanks to the burning of fossil fuels, large amount of carbon dioxide has been produced.

In addition, pollutants caused by vehicles in Hong Kong are terribly severe too. Vehicles, including buses and private cars, produce exhaust fumes while in operation. Carbon monoxide and carbon dioxide are released in the air. According to a government survey, 16,900 tonnes of sulphur dioxide were emitted by vehicles in 2010.

Those greenhouse gases contribute to air pollution and trap radiation at ground level. The air pollution raises the temperature in Hong Kong. If we do nothing to address the problem, we are going to have hotter and more sweltering summers. More importantly, this kind of pollution will immensely affect Hongkongers' health. In crowded areas like Mong Kok and Kwun Tong, there are fewer trees. Owing to the low photosynthesis rate in concrete jungles, the carbon dioxide level is high. Insufficient oxygen will lead to headaches and minor difficulties in breathing. Not only will citizens face higher risks of contracting bronchitis and tuberculosis in those areas, but also lung cancer. Air pollution poses a menace to our health. Furthermore, due to this situation, foreign investors are less likely to commit to our economy because of their worries about the health of their workers and the increase of medical costs of the company. Hong Kong's competitive edge decreases and the economic outlook of Hong Kong will become bleak.

Instead of painting a rosy picture of our future, it is high time we tackled the problem from the root. Recently, Hong Kong government has taken a step forward by organizing the Action Blue Sky Campaign aiming at raising the consciousness of clean air among Hongkongers. However, just propaganda is surely not enough. The government can discuss ways to reduce greenhouse gas emitted by the Pearl River Delta with mainland government officials. There is no doubt that air pollutants caused by the factories affect that area too. Should we convince them by telling them the seriousness of this issue, they would undoubtedly try to curb the problem. Meanwhile, our government ought to demand the two electricity companies to generate electricity by renewable sources like solar and wind energy in a certain proportions. The government can also provide some subsidies to public operations like hospitals, or even private buildings, to add a mini wind turbine or solar board on the rooftop so as to reduce the consumption of electricity.

Additionally, it is of utmost importance that the government has to set up stricter laws towards transportation. Take trucks as an example. The use of diesel commercial vehicles should be forbidden at this moment. All at once, the government should provide subsidies to encourage the drivers to replace their trucks with a newer model, e.g. Euro III or Euro IV. It is expected more than 80% of nitrogen oxides and suspended particles will be reduced. Hence, it will help alleviate and moderate air pollution. The government should also have better town planning, such as allowing more spaces between residential buildings and planting more trees in urban districts. Hence, we will enjoy fresher air.

Besides the government, concerted efforts by all of us are needed. We can simply conserve energy by using energy-saving light bulbs and switching off electronic gadgets when they are not in use. To maintain a sustainable environment, we should educate the public, especially our new generation, through promotion in popular social media, like Facebook. We can tell them Hong Kong is in jeopardy and we have to take action to save our dearest Hong Kong from suffocating.

Air pollution is growing at an alarming rate in our society. It is time for us to be part of the solution, not a part of the pollution. Though ameliorating and amending air quality is a long way to go, with our determination, dedication, devotion, it is no longer an unreachable dream for all of us.

Work for our next breath, work for our next generation. When we look at the sky again, to my strong personal belief, a blue sky is smiling to us!

In response to the serious crime on the leakage of personal data in a hospital which happened last week, I am writing to discuss what should be made public and what should remain private on social networking sites. I would also like to suggest some ways to protect our personal data.

In these days, due to the rapid development of technology, everyone can obtain others' information. On the contrary, many of us post our own personal information on social networking sites such as Facebook and Twitter. Other netizens, including those you don't really know, can get your data easily. The worst thing is that we will never know the reason why. Do they garner them for fun or for doing something illegal? First, the government should create some promotional videos to be shown during evening. The coverage is relatively higher than the period of morning and afternoon because scores of citizens are watching television during supper.

If I were the staff member of the Privacy Commissioner for Personal Data, I would inform the public how serious stealing others' information is. It can deter the public from infringing others' privacy. The penalty can stop them from doing this. As for teenagers, they should think twice when they post their personal details on the social networking sites. It is the most effective method to protect ourselves because no one can order us if you are unwilling to do so.

I firmly agree we should protect our privacy but I must emphasize that the responsibility of upholding privacy belongs to all netizens. I hope that the problem can be addressed as soon as possible.

As Internet become more prevalent, mobile phone, tablets, computers and even watches, are able to go online, sharing our own views and our own life has never been easier. However, everything comes with a cost. Cyber traps are everywhere, the most common but the most subtle one being personal information theft. This letter aims to act as a reference for different online users on the issue of online personal privacy.

This is just a small incident, but what it shows is grave. The reason why I like posting photos online is that I could show my life with my friends, true ones, but the precautions I do every time is just restricting my friends to understand me. In addition, posting photos online has just boosted my ego. If I had not built up the habit of posting photos online, I might have been able to avoid those consequences or I might have been more cautious on what should be made public.

This incident has inspired me on the discussion on what to make public and what to remain private. By considering both public and personal interest, this problem could be solved easily. There are many posts that were criticized by netizens, most of them had reached the bottom line of moral standard. These photos would be detrimental to the public, for example photos spreading hatred thoughts, which contain suicidal tendency or obscene content. All these are socially inappropriate content that will do harm to the society. Even a small stone could cause ripples that spread through the whole pool. We should never underestimate the consequence on the society of posting a photo online. The second thing we have to consider is whether or not the post will do harm to ourselves. In my case, I receive a warning letter. However, if you are a public figure, things would be completely different. Only one post is more than enough to tarnish your image

and demolish your future career. Often will people underestimate and overlook the dire consequence of posts, therefore posts that with unambiguous consequence should remain private. In conclusion, think twice before posting and posting nothing is always the best way to keep us out of trouble.

Although we could control what to post and what not to, personal privacy will still be infringed. Since the Internet is much more complicated than people recognized, hackers and identity thieves are everywhere. Having read the article about China tightening online censorship, I am writing to express my ultimate disappointment towards this move. Whether it is the internet, college classroom or corporate office, there is a virtual wall around us which separates China from the rest of the globe. As China is one of the most talked-about countries in the world, this issue has remained controversial for decades.

To start with, we have to understand the reason why the Communist Party has raised the great firewall. Since the Mao era, China has been adopting one party dictatorship. Ideas like freedom of speech and universal suffrage sound impossible in this country. In order to ensure that its political power is stable, the party blocks all criticisms and promotes concepts it wants. The other reason is that it is unwilling to reveal its violent and shameful history like Cultural Revolution and June 4th incident. It therefore distrusts these foreign ideas and concepts. Despite China's booming economy, we can see that it lacks the most important thing at the core, which is the intellectual freedom that makes up life in the academic context.

Owing to China's cyber security regulations, there are some major detrimental effects, which are undesirable.

First and foremost, not only does the censorship restrict online information, but also innovation, academic prospects and business. Consequently, the country's development would be hindered. Rogier Creemers, a research officer at Oxford University's Programme for Comparative Media Law and Policy, stated that the party would lose the initiative and could not enter the public sphere. A country without an open-minded government could never have improvements as it always traps itself in a cage, isolated from the globe. Because of China's strong suppression, rarely can we see innovative ideas there. Why can't the party break the useless wall built by itself and explore the world?

Secondly, the regulations cause a low sense of belonging of people. A survey done by the British bank Barclays last year found that 47% of more than 2000 high-worth Chinese are hoping to move within five years. Wealthy people are leaving China for better education and economic opportunities for their children. Even senior officials like Wen Jia Bao has no trust in China's future as well. He sent his children to foreign countries for education, instead of their hometown. Without these rich people, will China's economy keep flourishing? No, absolutely not. China's education faces many restrictions so the next generation would not be able to know the facts and to bring improvement. Such a low sense of belonging brought by China's censorship does no good but harm.

Lastly, this controversial issue creates a bad image of China. Due to series of actions including the driving out of the US search giant, Google and the expelling of academics in university, foreign countries would think that China is a conservative, strange and unsuccessful country. How can China succeed without any freedom? People are afraid of giving opinions, and they know nothing except worshipping the party. If this censorship continues, China will fail like those Kings who were not willing to seek advice from the coyotes. No one would like to see this miserable ending.
